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This is some of the paper that has been shredded and packed that our school helped collect & recycle!



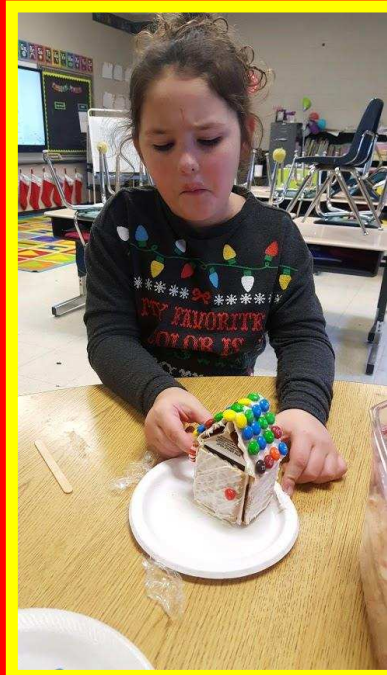
In the last two years, the Wiser Misers have arranged for our Recycling Center to make extra stops at HPS to help us recycle even more paper + cardboard boxes.



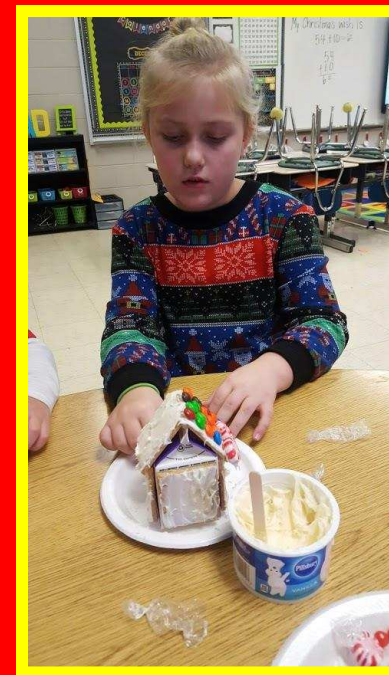

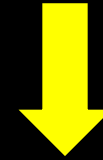

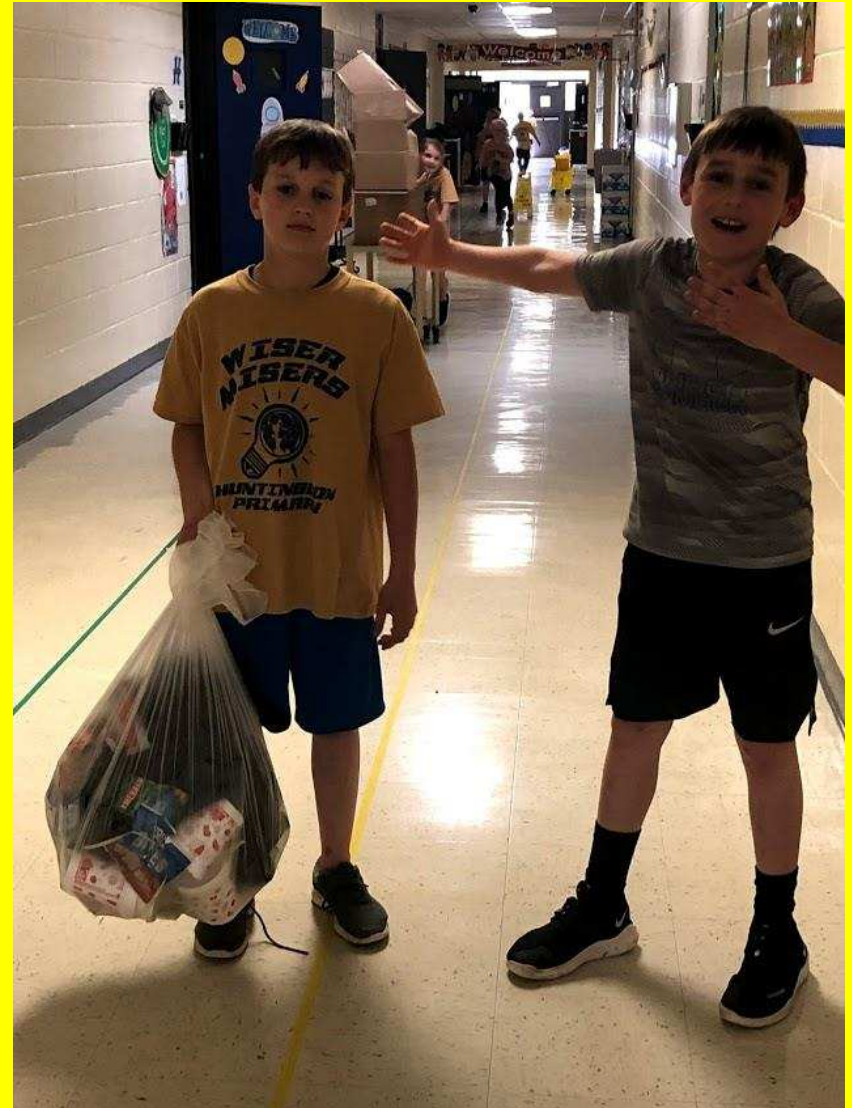


Mr. Lee Harris, a soil conservationist, spoke to us about the dangers of soil and water pollution.

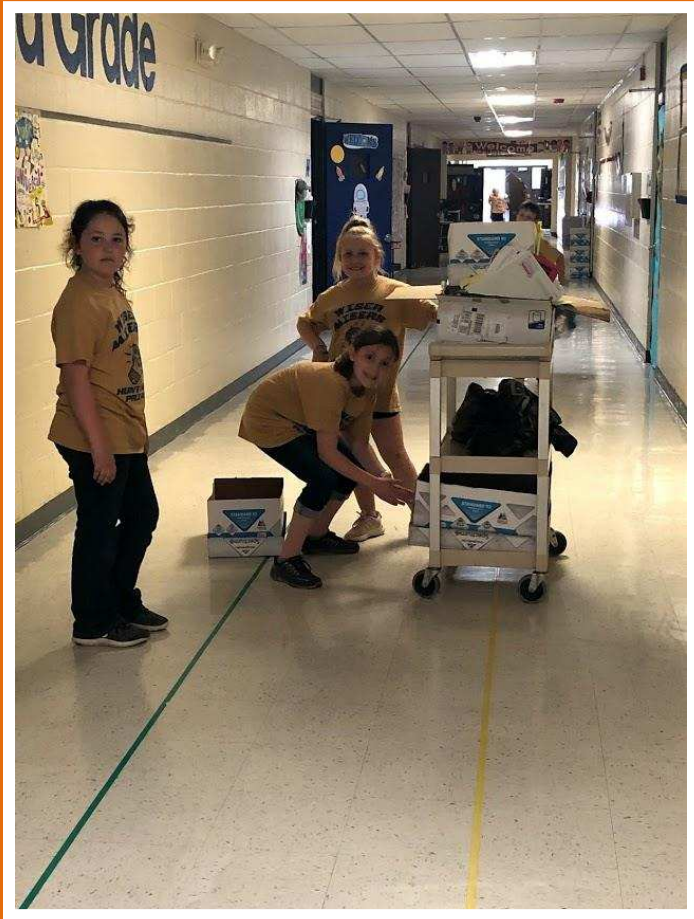




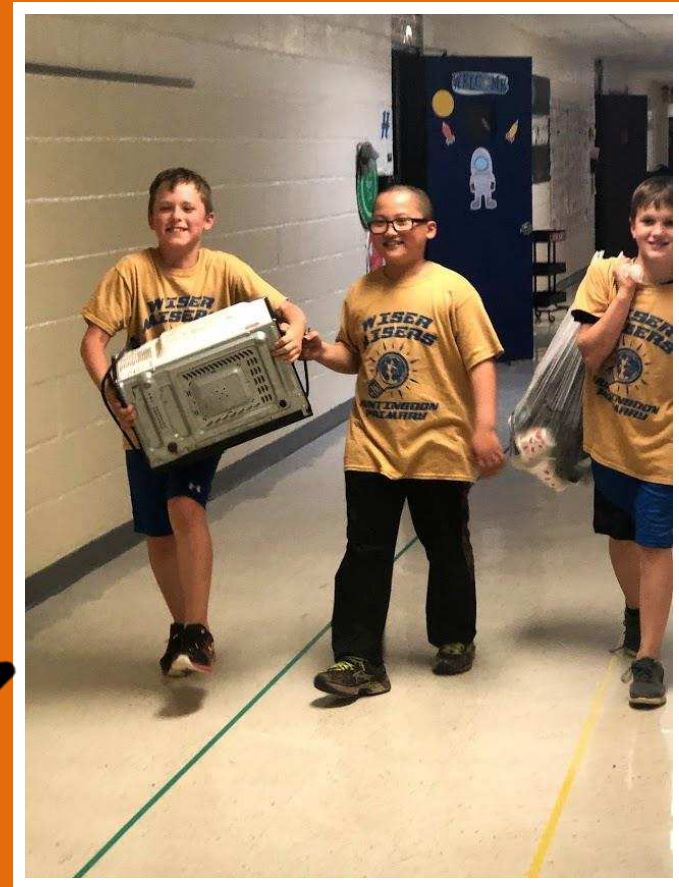
