

### Our Task

## Why We Recycle

We recycle because when we don't reuse plastic, a whopping 70% of this waste ends up in the ocean where marine life live. This debris eventually sinks to the bottom, damaging life on the seabed. Microplastic can be eaten by fish, which can end up on our plates.

Tragic events happen everyday due to the waste that gets thrown around. The litter that doesn't end up polluting the ocean, ends up polluting the air and land instead.





# Why We Recycle (Cont.)

Microplastic is found everywhere, even in your water supply and household dust. This is a foreign object passing through our body and most adults have BPA in their urine. 8 million tons of trash is tossed into the ocean each year and according to a study by the Ellen MacArthur Foundation on *The* New Plastics Economy, by 2050, there will be more trash than fish.



### What Plastic Is Recyclable?

#### **#1: PET (POLYETHYLENE TEREPHTHALATE)**

Water bottles and plastic soda bottles are the most commor containers made out of PET and the most common plastic recycled.

# #2: HDPE (HIGH-DENSITY POLYETHYLENE) Most milk jugs, detergent containers, and oil bottles are made of HDPE and it is recycled every now and then.

# #4: LDPE (LOW-DENSITY POLYETHYLENE) LDPE is what plastic bags are made of. It is also in shrink wraps and dry cleaner garment bags.

#### **#5: PP (POLYPROPYLENE)**

Polypropylene plastic is used in some margarine, yogurt containers, potato chip bags, cereal bags, and more. PP is considered safe for reuse, and can be recycled.



# Mistakes in Recycling

How do we know if it is recyclable? We check the triangles on the bottom of plastic bottles or containers to see if it has the numbers 1, 2,4 or 5.

#### Recycle

- Plastic bottles
- Papers
- Shredded Papers
- Newspaper

#### Don't Recycle

- Lip Gloss
- Banana Peels
- Liquids
- Gum


IF YOUR RECYCLING PROGRAM ACCEPTS GLASS, YES, ALL COLORS ARE ACCEPTABLE.






### What We Have Done
