




We built homes sticking to a budget and building code. We tried different types of insulation and tested the houses on a cold day. A thermal camera helped us see where the heat was escaping.







Sidekick Circuits and Candy Collector




We made circuits using copper tape and LED lights.




Candy represented energy for our town. We learned about renewable and nonrenewable energy.


Goal 4: Make a global impact
